

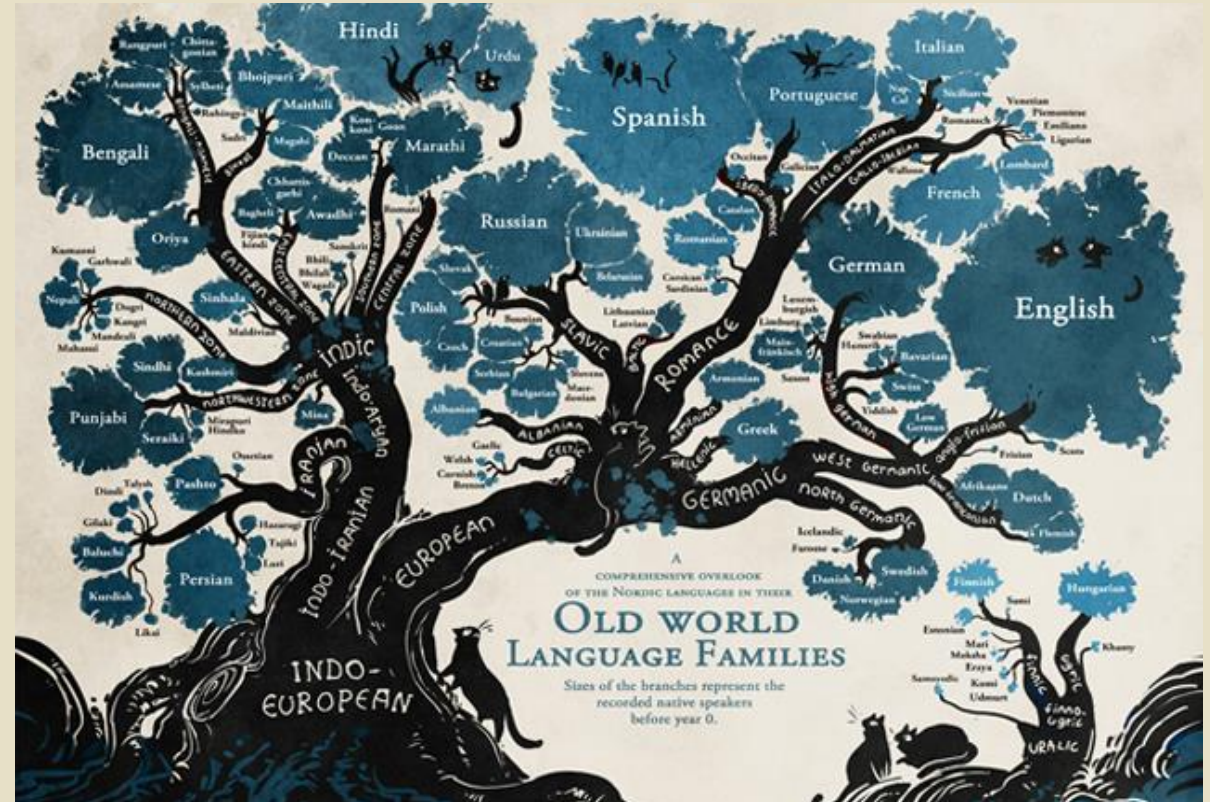


HISTORICAL WORDS WE SHOULD BRING BACK

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A Brief History of the English Language

- **Indo – European language family**
 - West Germanic language branch
- **Three periods**
 - **Old English** (450 – 1100 AD)
 - Anglo-Saxon tribes

 - **Middle English** (1100 – 1500 AD)
 - Beer, city, fruit, people
 - **Modern English** (since 1150)

 - Selfie, food baby, BYOD, bitcoin, apols



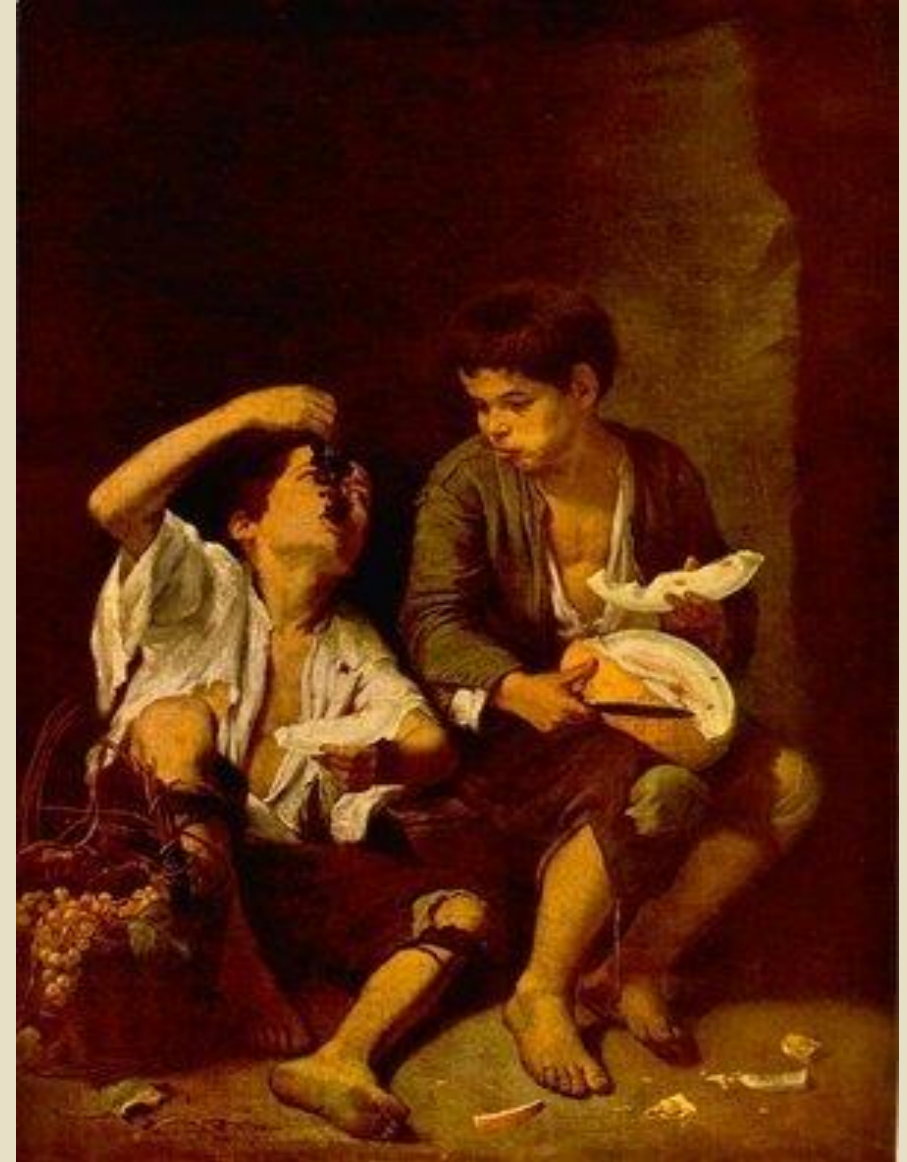
Uthceare

- People who are angry or unhappy with their government

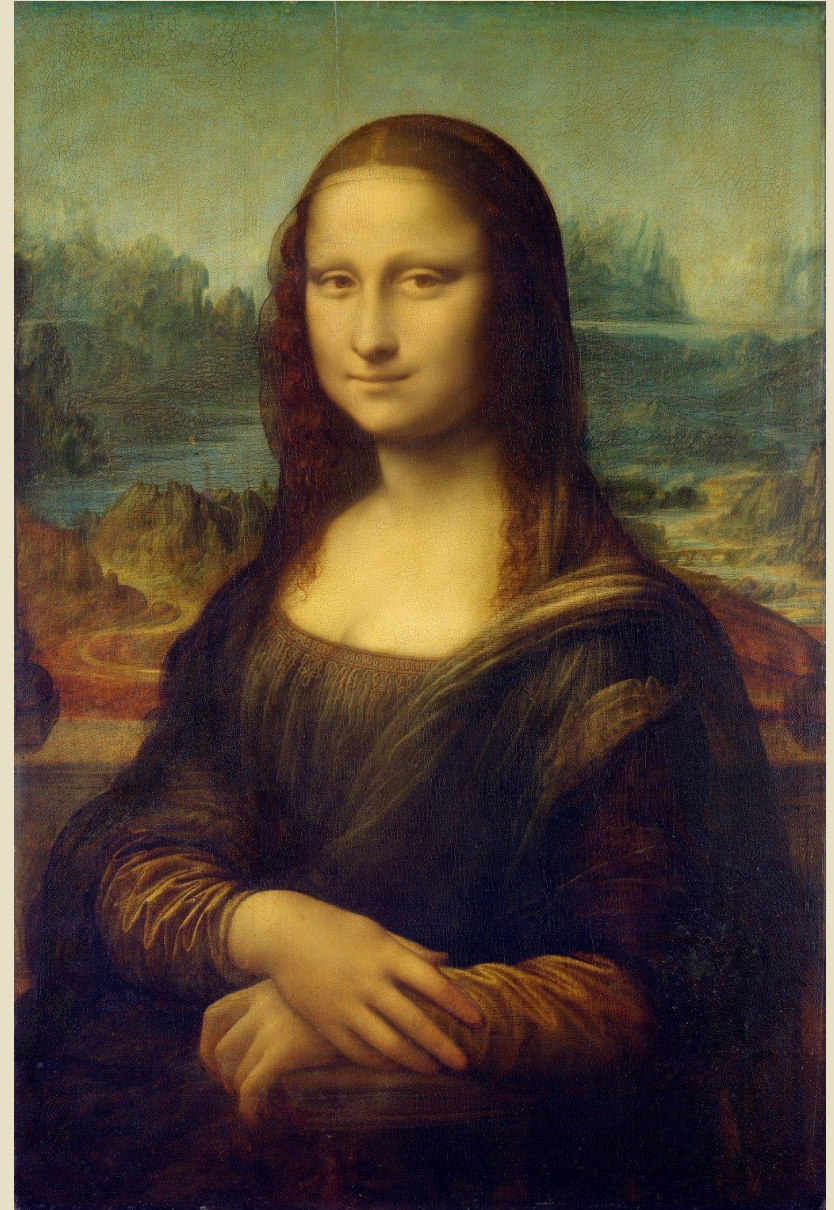
- 17th century

- Neither well or unwell

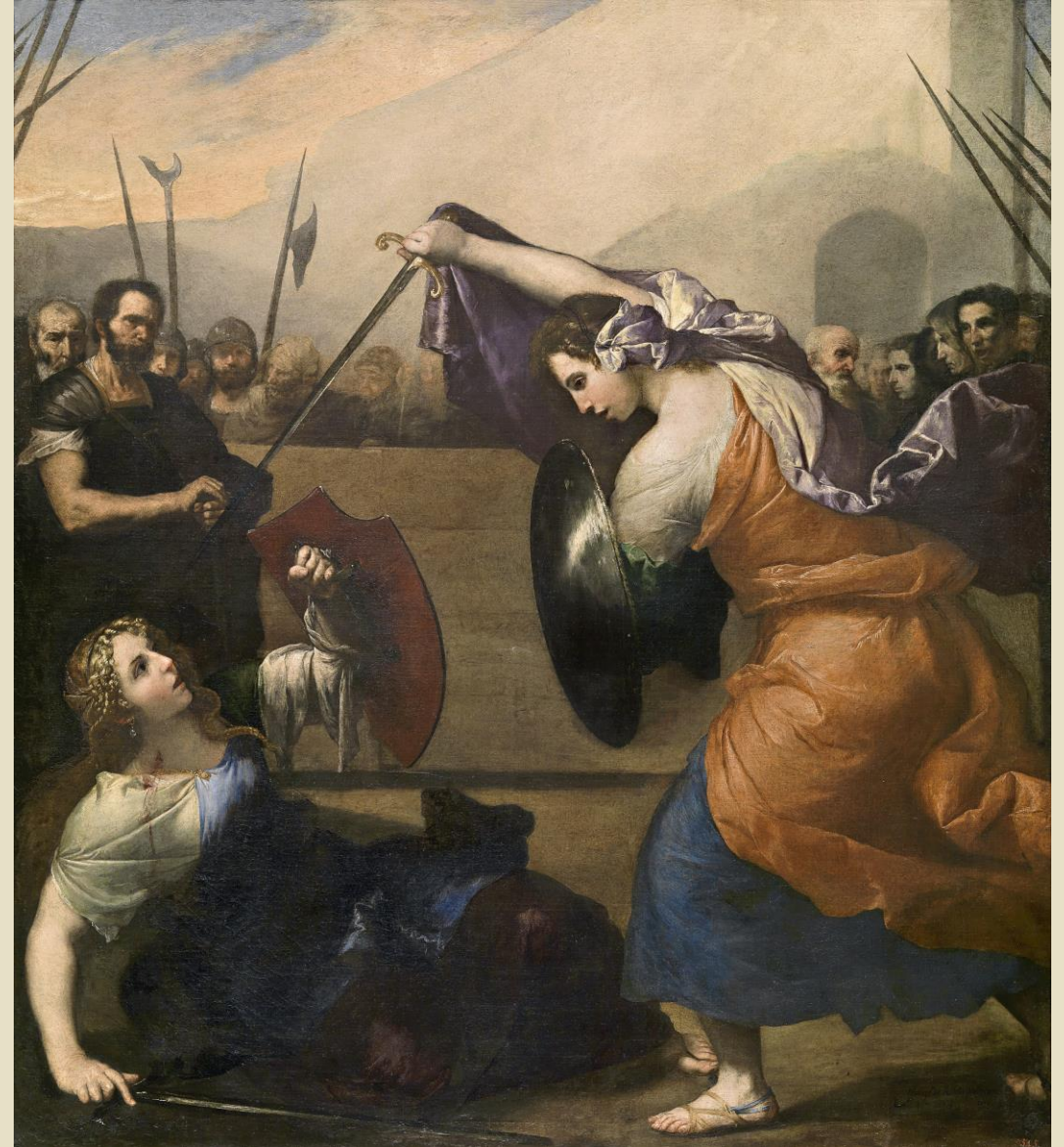
- 18th century
